PREPARATION FOR THE JOB

- Make sure you have a good understanding of who is on your team. Be aware things can change at any time before the jobs, so look out for any changes there may be.
- Make sure you have a good understanding of where the krew camp is on site. Click here to view.
- Bring refillable water bottle.
- Make sure you have read the 'Krew Chief' document. <u>Click here.</u>

ARRIVAL ON THE JOB

- Arrive at least 15 minutes early at the krew camp.
- Assist your team with getting checked-in at the krew camp.
- Some of the krew will need kit & safety shoes which is at the krew camp.
- Make sure everyone is wearing correct kit.

DURING THE JOB

- Help each other out. Make sure to assist less experienced and skilled krew.
- Stick with your team during the job! Do not mix teams unless it is requested by the client. The teams have been setup the way they have for a reason.
- Assist the newer krew and make sure everyone is helping each other out. Utilise the
 more experienced krew you have on your team to assist you in working together with
 the newer krew.
- If smaller groups are needed to be made within a team to complete tasks. Split the teams so that there is at least 1 Prospect, Experienced or Legend for every 2-4 general krew members.
- If you need assistance, have any questions or anything else, then make contact with the Krew Camp or one of the other Krew Chiefs on the day.
- Make sure krew are wearing safety shoes & Krown Krew kit.
- Ensure the krew are only speaking English or Danish on site.
- If there are any incidents that you know go against our 'Rules & Expectations' then you must report it to the krew camp.
- If you cannot connect to the krew camp via walkie talkie, then call Pete or one of the other Krew Chiefs directly.

AFTER THE JOB

• Tell your krew to return to camp & remind them check-out.
